Dear Parent/ Guardian,

Research and experience tell us that pupil progress will be impacted by lack of regular school attendance. As we begin a new school year, I have been focused on prioritising regular school attendance and considering both monitoring and intervention strategies, as well as incentives for those who continue to maintain excellent attendance.

**Last year whole school attendance at Braidside was 90.02%.** As a school, our target for attendance is 94%+ and that is once again the target for 23-24.

With the introduction of attendance tiers, I continue to undertake monthly analysis of attendance/ absence figures, across the school.

Attendance Tier	Percentage Attendance	September % (for each tier)
<b>1: Regular attendance</b>	<b>95%+</b>	<b>81.2%</b>
<b>1a At Risk</b>	<b>90-95%</b>	<b>7.2%</b>
<b>2. Chronic Attendance</b>	<b>80-90%</b>	<b>5.5%</b>
<b>3: Severe chronic attendance</b>	<b>&lt;80%</b>	<b>6.1%</b>

It is evident from the September data that many children in Braidside are in the 95% attendance tier, however we would aspire to have more children in this top tier. At the end of October, I will once again examine the attendance outcomes for all children.

**It is very encouraging that in September there were 209 children who had 100% attendance.** We hope this continues. At the end of October '23, all those children who have achieved 100% will receive a Homework Pass Reward.
